

LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT





WHAT HAPPENED THIS SUMMER?







Chinese children and their parents were banned from the city's public swimming pool for six days a week until 1945.

Segregation was imposed through restrictions on where Chinese people could own or rent property.

And if Chinese residents died, they were barred from Vancouver cemeteries.

All City contracts after 1890 contained a clause that prohibited contractors to use any Chinese labour.

Federal legislation excluding virtually all Chinese immigration, which was passed in 1923 and only lifted in 1947
